This year the Antique and Classic Car Club of Canada will celebrate its 64th Tour To Yesteryear. The "Tour To Yesteryear" is a week-long summer tour, hosted by one of 12 Regions.

These tours take place in a different Ontario location each year. Typically, about 75 to 90 vehicles participate in the tour. All active members of the A.C.C.C.C. are invited to attend. The 2023 tour will be held Sunday September 10th to Saturday September 16th, 2023.

It appears the ownership of one of Ontario's most famous beaches is changing hands.

In a tersely worded news release Tuesday morning, the Town of South Bruce Peninsula (SBP) said its received the Sauble Beach land claim decision "which is not in favour of the town's position on the matter."

Since 1995, The Saugeen First Nation has laid claim to a 2.5 kilometre stretch of Sauble Beach's shoreline stretching from Main Street north to 6th street, encompassing the most used and popular section of Sauble Beach waterfront.

The Town of South of Bruce Peninsula claims it owns that stretch of waterfront that attracts hundreds of thousands of visitors each year.

Testimony lasted until May 2022, when the judge in the case reserved her decision.

According to the Town of South Bruce Peninsula, that decision came out Tuesday in favour of the Saugeen First Nations claim to the stretch of beachfront.

Calls for comment to the town of South Bruce Peninsula and Saugeen First Nation have not yet been returned.



In the past, Saugeen First Nation has said if it were to win the land dispute, public access to Sauble Beach's waterfront would continue and beach goers would not notice many changes.

In today's news release SBP Mayor Garry Michi said, "This is a complex issue that requires time to formalize a position. Council understands how important this issue is to the town and thanks all residents in advance for their patience."

This news should not affect our summer plans as the dispute was one of the reasons we began looking at a street level location for Sauble Beach Sunset Cruisers back in 2019. Our organizers look forward to working with both Saugeen First Nations and the Town of South Bruce Peninsula to the benefit of residents, merchants, visitors and classic car owners of the region.

CRIME Stoppers Grey Bruce Gears Up For Classic Car Tours

Crime Stoppers Grey Bruce is getting ready to welcome back classic car owners for a series of more tours across the region.

Chairperson for Crime Stoppers Grey Bruce Peter Reid says following the success over the past three years, the organization has planned three car tours for this summer.

"We started these car tours back during Covid with the help of the members of

the classic car community and we are back again once again," says Reid.

The tours will kick off on June 25 with a tour and show in South Bruce County. The tour will invite drivers to hit the back roads, farms, rolling hills and villages of south-central Bruce County, with the organization hosting a stationary car show at the Paisley Palace Park from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. The event will also include a 1 p.m. shotgun start from Sauble Beach, Port Elgin and Kincardine.

Classic car owners will be invited back on Aug. 13, where classic and hobby cars will gather in Port Elgin, Sauble Beach, Wiarton, and Lion's Head and move out on a shotgun start at 1 p.m. on various routes around Northern Bruce Peninsula. Crime Stoppers volunteers will be handing out route maps for participants. The event will end at the Wiarton Keppel International Airport for an afternoon stationary show until 5 p.m.

The tours will come to an end on Sept. 24 with the third annual Keppel Classic Colour Tour. It will feature a 1 p.m. shotgun start from Sauble Beach, Wiarton, Owen Sound, and Port Elgin, and take car enthusiasts on a fall colour tour of old Keppel Township in Georgian Bluffs. Maps will be supplied by Crime Stoppers volunteers at all locations and will show a number of scenic routes across forests, cliffs, and waters around the area. The tour will come to an end at the Wiarton Keppel International Airport for an afternoon stationary show until 5 p.m.

"We raise funds two ways with these, we accept donations at the locations. There is no fee to attend, and then there is no fee for entry, but if you can donate, that's great. Last year we raised about \$3,000 from donations and we also run a 50/50 draw at Sauble Beach for the car shows there. We raised about \$1,000 last year from that as well," says Reid.

There will be a 50/50 draw at all events, and Reid says he is aiming to raise between \$6,000 to \$7,000 from this year's event.

The funds go towards Crime Stoppers Grey Bruce operating costs.
