# Owen Sound says goodbye to icon Bob Alexander Author of the article: Rob Gowan, Owen Sound Sun Times

A longtime stalwart of Owen Sound's classic vehicle, military and museum communities has passed away.

Bob Alexander, a Korean War veteran, died on Saturday at the age of 91.

Whether it was at the Bluewater Garage at the Grey Roots Museum and Archives, driving around town in his 1947 Ford pickup, chatting with friends over drinks at the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 6, or leading the annual Remembrance Day parade in his 1953 M38A1 army jeep, Mr. Alexander was a familiar face to both young and old for decades.

Mr. Alexander's son Dave said on Monday that his father was a great family man who had three other passions in his life – his vehicles, the military and the museum. "He loved being around people and talking to people," Dave said. "That is what we are hearing from people these last couple of days is that he was a great storyteller."

Robert William Alexander was born in Owen Sound on May 26, 1930, and grew up in the city at his family's home near the St. George's ball diamond.

Aside for his military stint in Korea and a couple of years in London when he returned to Canada following it, Mr. Alexander always called Owen Sound home. He lived at his home near St. Mary's High School since the mid-1950s. For his entire life the military was important to Mr. Alexander. His father William Arthur Alexander was a First World War veteran wounded near Hill 70 in December 1917. A monument installed at Grey Roots in 2019 was modelled after Mr. Alexander's uncle, Robert Oliver Alexander, who was also a First World War veteran wounded at Passchendaele on Oct, 26, 1917, the same day Tommy Holmes' actions earned him the Victoria Cross. Mr. Alexander joined the Canadian Army himself in 1949. The next year he went with the 25th Canadian Infantry Brigade to Korea, where he did a year-long deployment. While in Korea, he was attached to the Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers where he worked in a workshop near Pusan. While there he went on a month-long deployment to the forward operating bases where they repaired vehicles being used by the active soldiers.

Dave said his father was always very proud of his time with the army. "We would sit around and he would reflect back on his service," said Dave, who added that his father took many pictures during his time in Korea. "We would sit and look at some of the pictures. He could recall very detailed stories of his service." Following his time in Korea, Mr. Alexander had a longtime involvement with the Grey and Simcoe Foresters, where he was a Master Warrant Officer. "I remember growing up that he always enjoyed going to the summer camps," Dave said.

He also became involved with the 167 Billy Bishop Air Marshal VC Air Cadet Squadron, of which he was an early member back in the 1940s. He remained involved with the squadron and was a member of their alumni association. Mr. Alexander was also an active member of the Korea Veterans Association and a proud member of the legion in Owen Sound.

"He enjoyed going over to the legion with the guys on Fridays just to sit and have a beer and unfortunately COVID robbed him of that opportunity most recently," Dave said. "He was treated so well by the membership."

Dave said his dad always insisted on and enjoyed laying the wreath at the Remembrance Day ceremony for the Korean veterans. For many years he drove his jeep at the front of the Remembrance Day parade with other veterans as his passengers. "Of course he loved going to the legion afterwards, talking to the fellas and maybe even imbibe in a few drinks," Dave said.

Mr. Alexander worked for the Ontario Department of Highways and the Ministry of Transportation for close to 35 years, retiring in 1987. Dave said his father enjoyed his work there as a heavy mechanic, sometimes working on snowplows out on the road.

"For many years they would send him out in a truck if a snowplow was broken down," Dave said. "He would work in a big wrecker sometimes pulling plows out of the ditches. He always found that interesting because you had to be careful in dealing with these great big pieces of heavy machinery."

Mr. Alexander spent countless hours in his garage working on old vehicles – but only Fords.

"The one vehicle many Owen Sounders will remember, and it was an iconic vehicle that was on the roads for decades – and it still might make a return to the roads again – was his '47 Ford pickup," Dave said. "He pieced that together in the early 1970s and it was on the road since then."

Other prized vehicles Mr. Alexander had included a 1931 Model A Victoria, a 1938 Ford Cabriolet and his 1953 jeep. He had been working on a Second World War Ford pattern truck, but wasn't able to complete that project.

Mr. Alexander was a member of the Bluewater Region Car Club. Many members of that club took part in a 90th birthday drive-by celebration held for Mr. Alexander in May 2020 that attracted about 100 vehicles.

And then there was Mr. Alexander's involvement with Grey Roots, where he volunteered for about three decades.

"He loved going to Grey Roots and volunteering there," Dave said. When Grey Roots' predecessor – the Grey County Museum – was located in Owen Sound he sat on the museum board and was instrumental in creating the Bluewater Garage. "So many people associate him with the Bluewater Garage, their visits to the garage they had, the tow truck in the garage and all the old cars they had," Dave said. "Of course, he loved to chat with all the patrons as they came through."

In a 2015 interview, Mr. Alexander admitted he got great joy out of seeing the faces of the visitors when he would let the children climb into one of the vehicles and lay on the horn. "It's as much fun watching the face of the child as it is watching the face of the mother when that happens," Mr. Alexander said. "It's the little things that I really enjoy, like watching that mother's face when the horn goes ah-oo-gah."

Mr. Alexander received an Owen Sound Cultural Award for volunteer service in 2014 and was recognized with the Lieutenant Governor's Ontario Heritage Award lifetime achievement in 2016.

Grey Roots Volunteer and Village Coordinator Stephanie McMullen said Monday that Mr. Alexander was chair of the museum board when she started there in 1999 and she worked with him ever since.

She said he was very welcoming to her when she started and through the years there was never any question about his passion for history, antique cars and for honouring local veterans.

"He felt that it was really important that we understand the roles veterans played in creating the society we have right now and that we should honour and respect them," said McMullen. "He also had that appreciation for vehicles, particularly Fords, and the role that vehicles had in making things possible in our society."

McMullen remembers how much Mr. Alexander loved engaging with children both at the museum and his own personal garage. "He actually had my older two kids over to his garage when he first started working on military pattern vehicles and gave them a tour of the different machinery and the different vehicle parts," McMullen said. "It was pretty cool."

And the storytelling was always something McMullen looked forward to with Mr. Alexander. "He loved to tell stories and literally at the beginning of every volunteer shift and at the end of every volunteer shift he would tell me stories," said McMullen. "Some of them were about what had gone on with visitors to the garage throughout the day, but others were stories of things that had happened in his life. "It was always fun and there was always a good story when you were talking to Bob."

We assembled in Owen Sound and drove to Grey Gables Retirement Home in Markdale to visit one of our founding members, Gilbert Rice.
